

Copernican PrincipleAge of the Earth



Nicolaus Copernicus

- 19 February 1473 24 May 1543
- Discovered that the solar system is Heliocentric and not Geocentric
- Aristarchus of Samos (ca. 310 BCE – ca. 230 BCE)
- [It is my] loving duty to seek the truth in all things, in so far as God has granted that to human reason.

Copernican Principle

- Earth is one of many planets that orbit the Sun
- The Earth is one among millions of inhabitable planets (Principle of Mediocrity)
- Carl Sagan said "Our planet is a lonely speck in the great enveloping cosmic Dark"

 N = the number of civilizations in our galaxy with which communication might be possible (i.e. which are on our current past light cone);


- \mathbb{R}_{*} = the average rate of star formation in our galaxy
- fp = the fraction of those stars that have planets
- ne = the average number of planets that can potentially support life per star that has planets
- fl = the fraction of planets that could support life that actually develop life at some point
- fi = the fraction of planets with life that actually go on to develop intelligent life (civilizations)
- fc = the fraction of civilizations that develop a technology that releases detectable signs of their existence into space
- L = the length of time for which such civilizations release detectable signals into space



 Currently estimated to be 1 to 5 / system






Earth's Magnetic Field




Earth's Magnetic Field and Solar Wind




