The Questions God Asks

Where are you? (Genesis 3)

What is that in your hand? (Exodus 4)

What are you doing here? (1 Kings 19)

Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin? (Haggai 1)

 ⁹ Then the Lord God called to Adam and said to him, "Where are you?"

Foundation of the relationship: Genesis 2

 ¹⁶ And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

 ¹Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?"

² And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; ³ but of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.' "

 ⁴ Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. ⁵ For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

A slippery slope

- Doubt: "Has God indeed said...?"
- Misrepresentation: "'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden?'"; "You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'"
- Contradiction: "You will not surely die."

 ⁶ So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate.

A multi-sensory appeal

- Flesh: Physical Practicality
- Eyes: Pleasant to the eyes
- Pride of Life: Desire to make one wise

An outcome with eternal consequences

- Shame/Fear
- Excuses
- Mistrust and Alienation

Where are you?

- Loss of intimacy
- Lost Man & A Seeking God
- Man's Sin & God's Grace

• ¹¹ And He said, "Who told you that you *were* naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?"
