20 that we also may be like all the nations, that our king may judge us and fight our battles."

7 The Lord said to Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in regard to all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected Me from being king over them.


God Planned for It

Solomon's Disobedience

1 Kings 11:9-13

9 Now the Lord was angry with Solomon because his heart was turned away from the Lord, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice

10 and had commanded him concerning this thing, that he should not go after other gods; but he did not observe what the Lord had commanded.

11 So the Lord said to Solomon, "Because you have done this, and you have not kept My covenant and My statutes, which I have commanded you, I will surely tear the kingdom from you, and will give it to your servant

12 Nevertheless I will not do it in your days for the sake of your father David, but I will tear it out of the hand of your son.

13 However, I will not tear away all the kingdom, but I will give one tribe to your son for the sake of My servant David and for the sake of Jerusalem which I have chosen."




Don'ts

Multiply Horses | Wives | Wealth

Deuteronomy 17:16-17

16 Moreover, he shall not **multiply horses** for himself, nor shall he cause the people to return to Egypt to **multiply horses**, since the Lord has said to you, 'You shall never again return that way.'

17 He shall not multiply wives for himself, or else his heart will turn away; nor shall he greatly increase silver and gold for himself


1 John 2:15-17

Write the Law | Read the Law | Obey the Law

Deuteronomy 17:18-20

18 "Now it shall come about when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, he shall write for himself a copy of this law on a scroll in the presence of the Levitical priests.

19 It shall be with him and he shall read it all the days of his life, that he may learn to fear the Lord his God, by carefully observing all the words of this law and these statutes,

20 that his heart may not be lifted up above his countrymen and that he may not turn aside from the commandment, to the right or the left, so that he and his sons may continue long in his kingdom in the midst of Israel


- Open my eyes, that I may behold wonderful things from Your law.

David, A Man After God's Own Heart

Following God's Commands / Will

1 Samuel 13:14

14 ... The Lord has sought out for Himself a man after His own heart, and the Lord has appointed him as ruler over His people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you."

Acts 13:22

22 After He had removed him, He raised up David to be their king, concerning whom He also testified and said, 'I have found David the son of Jesse, a man after My heart, who will do all My will.'

1 Kings 15:5

5 because David did what was right in the sight of the Lord, and had not turned aside from anything that He commanded him all the days of his life, except in the case of Uriah the Hittite.

Psalm 139:23-24

- 23 Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxious thoughts;
- 24 And see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way.

- Obeying what God has commanded / doing His will
- Does not mean perfection – but still requires repentance

Asa - 2 Chronicles 15:15

15 All Judah rejoiced concerning the oath, for they had sworn with their whole heart...

Jehoshaphat - 2 Chronicles 17:6

6 He took great pride in the ways of the Lord...

Josiah – 2 Kings 23:25

25 Before him there was no king like him who turned to the Lord with all his heart and with all his soul and with all his might, according to all the law of Moses; nor did any like him arise after him.

Josiah – 2 Kings 22:19

19 because your heart was tender and you humbled yourself before the Lord when you heard what I spoke against this place and against its inhabitants that they should become a desolation and a curse, and you have torn your clothes and wept before Me, I truly have heard you," declares the Lord.

Tender Heart

Zedekiah - 2 Chronicles 36:12-13

12 He did evil in the sight of the Lord his God: he did not humble himself before Jeremiah the prophet who spoke for the Lord.

13 He also rebelled against King Nebuchadnezzar who had made him swear allegiance by God. But he stiffened his neck and hardened his heart against turning to the Lord God of Israel.

Versus
Hardened Heart

Uzziah - 2 Chronicles 26:16

16 But when he became strong, his heart was so proud that he acted corruptly, and he was unfaithful to the Lord his God, for he entered the temple of the Lord to burn incense on the altar of incense.

Versus Proud Heart

Doing His Will by Trusting Him

Being directed and guided by God by clinging to Him

Hezekiah – 2 Kings 18:5-6

5 He trusted in the Lord, the God of Israel; so that after him there was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor among those who were before him.

6 For he clung to the Lord; he did not depart from following Him, but kept his commandments, which the Lord had commanded Moses.

Ahaziah - 2 Kings 1:16

16 Then he said to him, "Thus says the Lord, 'Because you have sent messengers to inquire Baal-zebub, the god of Ekron – is it because there is no God in Israel to inquire of His word? – therefore you shall not come down from the bed where you have gone up, but shall surely die."

Clung to the Lord

Trusted in other gods

Doing His Will by Seeking Him

Desiring to know, understand, and discern His ways

Jehoshaphat – 2 Chronicles 19:3

3 ...you have set your heart to seek God

Josiah – 2 Kings 22:11-13

- 11 When the king heard the words of the book of the law, he tore his clothes.
- **12** Then the king commanded Hilkiah the priest, Ahikam the son of Shaphan, Achbor the son of Micaiah, Shaphan the scribe, and Asaiah the king's servant saying,
- 13 Go, inquire of the Lord for me and the people and all Judah concerning the words of this book that has been found, for great is the wrath of the Lord that burns against us, because our fathers have not listened to the words of this book, to do according to all that is written concerning us."

Josiah – 2 Chronicles 35:22

22 However, Josiah would not turn away from him, but disguised himself in order to make war with him; nor did he listen to the words of Neco from the mouth of God, but came to make war on the plain of Megiddo.

Reasons for the Exile

Rejected God | Sold Themselves | Resulting Sins

2 Kings 17:7-14

7 Now this came about because the sons of Israel had sinned against the Lord their God, who had brought them up from the land of Egypt from under the hand of Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and they had feared other gods

8 and walked in the customs of the nations whom the Lord had driven out before the sons of Israel, and in the customs of the kings of Israel which they had introduced.

- **9** The sons of Israel did things secretly which were not right against the Lord their God. Moreover, they built for themselves high places in all their towns, from watchtower to fortified city.
- 10 They set for themselves sacred pillars and Asherim on every high hill and under every green tree,
- 11 and there they burned incense on all the high places as the nations did which the Lord has carried away to exile before them; and they did evil things provoking the Lord.
- 12 They served idols, concerning which the Lord had said to them, "You shall not do this thing."
- 13 Yet the Lord warned Israel and Judah through all His prophets and every seer, saying, "Turn from your evil ways and keep My commandments, My statutes according to all the law which I commanded your fathers, and which I sent to you through My servants the prophets."
- 14 However, they did not listen, but stiffened their neck like their fathers, who did not believe in the Lord their God.

Reasons for the Exile

Rejected God | Sold Themselves | Resulting Sins

2 Kings 17:15-22

15 They rejected His statutes and His covenant which He made with their fathers and His warnings with which He warned them. And they followed vanity and became vain, and went after the nations which surrounded them, concerning which the Lord had commanded them not to do like them.

- 16 They forsook all the commandments of the Lord their God and made for themselves molten images, even two calves, and made an Asherah and worshipped all the host of heaven and served Baal.
- 17 Then they made their sons and their daughters pass through the fire, and practiced divination and enchantments, and sold themselves to do evil in the sight of the Lord, provoking Him.
- **18** So the Lord was very angry with Israel and removed them from His sight; none was left except the tribe of Judah.
- **19** Also Judah did not keep the commandments of the Lord their God, but walked in the customs which Israel had introduced.
- 20 The Lord rejected all the descendants of Israel and afflicted them and gave them into the hand of plunderers, until He had cast them out of His sight.
- 21 When He had torn Israel from the house of David, they made Jeroboam the son of Nebat king. Then Jeroboam drove Israel away from following the Lord and made them commit a great sin.
- 22 The sons of Israel walked in all the sins of Jeroboam which he did; they did not depart from them

Jeroboam's Great Sin Continued

King of Israel	Reference to Jeroboam's Sin	
Nadab	1 Kings 15:26	"walked in the way of his father and in his sin which he made Israel sin."
Baasha	1 Kings 16:2	"you have walked in the way of Jeroboam and have made My people Israel sin"
Zimri	1 Kings 16:19	"walking in the way of Jeroboam, and in his sin which he did, making Israel sin."
Omri	1 Kings 16:26	"he walked in all the way of Jeroboamand in his sins which he made Israel sin."
Ahab	1 Kings 16:31	"a trivial thing for him to walk in the sins of Jeroboam"
Ahaziah	1 Kings 22:52	"walked in the way of his fatherhis mother and in the way of Jeroboam"
Joram	2 Kings 3:3	"he clung to the sins of Jeroboamwhich he made Israel sin"

Jeroboam's Great Sin

Drove Israel away from following God through false worship

1 Kings 12:26-33

26 Jeroboam said in his heart, "Now the kingdom will return to the house of David.

27 If this people go up to offer sacrifices in the house of the Lord at Jerusalem, then the heart of this people will return to their lord, even to Rehoboam king of Judah."

28 So the king consulted, and made two golden calves, and he said to them, "It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem; behold your gods, O Israel, that brought you up from the land of Egypt."

29 He set one in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan.

30 Now this thing became a sin, for the people went up to worship before the one as far as Dan.

31 And **he made** houses on high places, and made priests from among all the people who were not of the sons of Levi.

32 Jeroboam instituted a feast in the 8th month on the 15th day of the month, like the feast which was in Judah, and he went up to the altar; thus he did in Bethel, sacrificing to the calves which he had made. And he stationed in Bethel the priests of the high places which he had made.

33 Then he went up to the altar **which he had made** in Bethel on the 15th day in the 8th month, even in the month which he had devised in his own heart; and he instituted a feast for the sons of Israel and went up to the altar to burn incense.

Did not trust God's promise through Ahijah the prophet

Made the true God to be two gods in the form of calves

Jeroboam devised how God should be worshipped

- Wrong Place
- Wrong People
- Wrong Time
