The Law cannot...

declare us righteous before God (3:11)

govern our fellowship (2:12-14)

sanctify us (3:3)

coexist with grace (5:4)

be kept partially without cursing us all (3:10)

3 appeals from contrast against legalism from Galatians 4

V1-11 - An appeal from our position in Christ.

V12-20 - An appeal from Paul's personal ministry

The Fine Print

24-25 The Covenant of the Law

26-27 The Covenant of Promise

Symbolized by Hagar

Proceeds from Mt. Sinai where The Law was given

Capital: Present Jerusalem

Mothers slave children

Produces a declining offspring tied to the fortunes of the earthly Jerusalem

Symbolized by Sarah

Proceeds from heaven

Capital: Heavenly Jerusalem

Mothers free children

Produces an increasing offspring tied to the fortunes of the heavenly Jerusalem

Implications - V28-31

The Covenant of the Law

The Covenant of Promise

Produces children of the flesh

Persecutes the children of the Spirit

Law

Slave: No inheritance

Produces children of the Spirit

Expects persecution from those under the Law

Free: Heir of heaven

Applications:

Cast out the bondwoman and her son

We are not children of a bondwoman, but of the free woman
